We have also audited the accompanying Balance Sheet, Statement of Revenues, Expenditures and Change in Fund Balance and Statement of Revenues, Expenditures and Change in Fund Balance – Budget and Actual for the Measure AA Bond Program Fund of the Paramount Unified School District for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2008. These statements are the responsibility of the District's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these statements based on our audit.

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles as prescribed by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board and <u>Audits of State and Local Governmental Units</u> issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants.

FUND STRUCTURE

The Statement of Revenues, Expenditures and Change in Fund Balance is a statement of financial activities of the Measure AA Bond Program Fund related to the current reporting period. Expenditures frequently include amounts for land, buildings, equipment, retirement of indebtedness, transfers to other funds, etc. Consequently, these statements do not purport to present the result of operations or the net income or loss for the period as would a statement of income for a profit-type organization.

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The Measure AA Bond Program Fund is maintained on the modified accrual basis of accounting. As such, revenues are recognized when they become susceptible to accrual, which is to say, when they become both measurable and available to finance expenditures of the current period. Expenditures are recognized in the accounting period in which the liability is incurred (when goods are received or services rendered).

Cash in the County Treasury is recorded at cost, which approximates fair value, in accordance with the requirements of GASB Statement No. 31.

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES: (continued)

BUDGET

The Statement of Revenues, Expenditures and Change in Fund Balance – Budget and Actual includes a column titled "Budget". The amounts in this column represent the budget adopted by the Board and all amendments throughout the year.

CAPITAL ASSETS AND LONG-TERM DEBT

The accounting and reporting treatment applied to the capital assets and long-term liabilities associated with the Measure AA Bond Program Fund are determined by its measurement focus. The Measure AA Bond Program Fund is accounted for on a spending or "financial flow" measurement focus. This means that only current assets and current liabilities are generally included on the balance sheet. The reported fund balance is considered a measure of "available spendable resources". Thus, the capital assets and long-term liabilities associated with the Measure AA Bond Program Fund are accounted for in the basic financial statements of the Paramount Unified School District.

NOTE 2 – DEPOSITS:

In accordance with the California School Accounting Manual, the District maintains its cash related to the Measure AA Bond Program Fund in the Los Angeles County treasury as part of the common investment pool. These pooled funds are carried at cost which approximates fair value. The fair market value of the District's Measure AA Bond Program Fund deposits in this pool as of June 30, 2008, as provided by the pool sponsor, was \$29,210,165. Interest earned is deposited quarterly into the participating fund. Any investment losses are proportionately shared by all funds in the pool.

NOTE 3 – EXCESS OF EXPENDITURES OVER APPROPRIATIONS:

Excesses of expenditures over appropriations, by major object accounts, occurred in the Measure AA Bond Program Fund.

NOTE 4 – GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS:

2006 Bonds - Series 2007

On November 7, 2006, the voters approved the issuance of bonds, not to exceed \$32,000,000 for the purpose of financing the acquisition, construction and modernization of District facilities:

On August 1, 2007, the District offered for sale \$32,000,000 of general obligation bonds under the provisions of Title I, Division 1, Part 10, Chapters 1 and 1.5 of the State of California Education Code, commencing with Section 15100, as amended, and Article XIII A of the California Constitution and pursuant to resolutions adopted by the Board of Education of the District and by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles. The bonds represent the total available of \$32,000,000 of bonds approved by District voters on November 7, 2006.

Principal of the bonds is payable on August 1 each year. Interest rates range from 4.250% to 5.25%. Interest on the bonds is payable on each February 1 and August 1 beginning February 1, 2008.

2006 Bonds - Series 2007 (continued)

The repayment of the debt related to the general obligations bonds is accounted for in the District's Bond Interest and Redemption Fund which is part of the Paramount Unified School District's basic financial statements. The recognition of \$823,729 of the total premium of \$1,213,312 on bonds and the recognition of issuance costs of \$823,729 is recorded as proceeds and other expenses, respectively, in these financial statements. The remaining premium balance of \$389,583 has been recorded in the District's Bond Interest and Redemption Fund.

NOTE 5 – PURCHASE COMMITMENTS:

As of June 30, 2008, the District had approximately \$17,930,000 of commitments for Paramount High School construction and modernization projects.

We have audited the basic financial statements of Paramount Unified School District (the District) as of and for the year ended June 30, 2008 and have issued our report thereon dated December 4, 2008. We have also audited the accompanying Balance Sheet, Statement of Revenues, Expenditures and Change in Fund Balance and Statement of Revenues, Expenditures and Change in Fund Balance – Budget and Actual for the Measure AA Bond Program Fund of the Paramount Unified School District for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2008. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.

Internal Control Over Financial Reporting

In planning and performing our audit, we considered Paramount Unified School District's internal control over the financial reporting as a basis for designing our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the Measure AA Bond Program Fund financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the District's internal control over Measure AA Bond Program Fund financial reporting. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the District's internal control over Measure AA Bond Program Fund financial reporting.

A control deficiency exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent or detect misstatements on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a control deficiency, or a combination of control deficiencies, that adversely affects the District's ability to initiate, authorize, record, process, or report financial data reliably in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles such that there is more than a remote likelihood that a misstatement of the District's Measure AA Bond Program Fund financial statements that is more than inconsequential will not be prevented or detected by the District's internal control.

REPORT ON INTERNAL CONTROL OVER FINANCIAL REPORTING AND ON COMPLIANCE AND OTHER MATTERS BASED ON AN AUDIT OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS PERFORMED IN ACCORDANCE WITH GOVERNMENT AUDITING STANDARDS

A material weakness is a significant deficiency, or a combination of significant deficiencies, that results in more than a remote likelihood that a material misstatement of the Measure AA Bond Program Fund financial statements will not be prevented or detected by the District's internal control.

Our consideration of internal control over financial reporting was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and would not necessarily identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be significant deficiencies or material weaknesses. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over Measure AA Bond Program Fund financial reporting that we consider to be material weaknesses, as defined above.

Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether Paramount Unified School District's financial statements are free of material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of financial statement amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our audit and, accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of non-compliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Board, the Citizens' Oversight Committee and management. It is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.
