How do we use data to inform the LCAP?

The LCAP is updated each year to reflect and respond to students' needs. We use data from multiple sources to identify what is working, what needs to change and the actions we will take to make changes for the next year.


The LCAP Committee uses these sources of data:

Staff Surveys: Elementary Schools




Total number of survey responses equals 284, not all respondents answered each question.

To what degree have your students benefited from the following LCAP actions and services?





How much have you benefitted from each of these activities and services?



A great deal Some-what Very little Not at all



We use metrics to monitor progress

The LCAP is updated each year with locally selected metrics (or measures) that address the 8 State Priorities.

For last year, 2015-16 Annual Update results were updated for

- Goal 1: Support Academic Progress and Behavior: Assess student performance
 - Met 5 of our 7 metrics (reported in October)
- Goal 2: Create a College Going Culture
 - Met 4 of our 6 metrics (reported in October)
- Goal 4: Provide Basic Services
 - Met 3 of our 3 metrics (reported Quarterly)

Changes for LCAP Metrics, 2016-17

- Must address state indicators in the CA Dashboard:
 - any orange or red results
 - gaps of two or more color band from the "all" group compared to any other student group.
- Include locally defined targets for local indicators.
- Align to the CA Dashboard, including new indicators such as 3-8 SBAC English Language Arts and Math



PREPARING STUDENTS FOR COLLEGE AND CAREERS

In addition to surveys the LCAP Committee reviewed:

- Chronic Absenteeism rates
- Suspension rates
- Advanced Placement passing rates
- AP participation rates
- 5 x 5 report on the CA Dashboard
- CA Dashboard indicators for graduation rate

Outcomes will be shared in the 2016-17 Annual update

Trends Across Data Sources

After reviewing data from all surveys, the following were identified as areas of greatest progress:

- Collaboration time at schools
- Professional development provided
- Increased technology to support learning
- AVID in middle and high school
- College and Career Centers, College Testing (PSAT for all, SAT prep. Classes)

Meeting New Needs

LCFF funding requires that each year districts analyze the services and programs they provide and ask:

- What has been our greatest progress?
- What are our greatest needs?
- What gaps do we still need to address?

After closely analyzing needs to proactively support schools, the following new positions are recommended for 2017-18.

Recommended Staff to Meet Needs, 2017-18

Position	Rationale	Recommendation	Funding
Behavior Intervention Specialists (2)	MIddle schools have high numbers of students who need conentrated behavior support.Currently one BIS is assigned to five middle schools and Collins has only a half time position.	Hire two BISs: one assigned full time to Collins to meet behavior needs; one to spend more time at middle schools.	Mental Health Funds \$210,000
Social Worker (1)	Collins has the highest rate of student transciency and students in Foster Care. Counselors, administrators spend extensive time helping parents access mental health and social services their children need, which impacts the time they spend on counseling, monitoring instruction or proactively working with teachers.	Hire one social worker for Collins School to meet students' and families' need to access social support services.	LCAP S/C Funds \$60,000

Recommended Staff to Meet Needs, 2017-18

Position	Rationale	Recommendation	Funding
Elective Teachers (5 total: 1 per middle school)	Approximately 170 students at each middle school will take AVID or Project Lead the Way STEM electives in 2017- 18.These new courses require an additional FTE to provide the necessary core subjects students need.	Add one full time teacher to each middle school to meet the need for expanded elective courses.	LCAP S/C Funds \$420,000
ECE Specialist (1)	There is a need to provide early parent education on how to develop literacy and language in young children before they enter school. Additionally, there is a need to provide information on resources for children ages 0-5.	Hire an ECE Curriculum Specialist to support early outreach as part of a comprehensive preschool program.	Title III Funds \$100,000
Total		Mental Health Funds LCAP S/C Funds Title III Funds	\$210,000 \$500,000 \$100,00
