What is the history of 9-12 Safe and Civil Schools in PUSD?

Safe and Civil Schools Program began implementation at the 9-12 level in 2014-15:

- 2014-15 High Schools and CDS established Safe and Civil Schools Leadership Teams and developed common area expectations.
- **2015-16** High Schools and CDS established tiered level system for responding to student misbehavior.
- 2016-17 High Schools and CDS received professional development on attendance and early stage interventions.

- Decrease overall suspension, truancy, and chronic absentee rates for all students, and ensure no student group is overrepresented in them

- 3. Create a safe and civil learning environment for all stakeholders that incorporates restorative practices
- 4. All school facilities will be clean, orderly, well maintained, and modern

Guidelines for Success

- Not all students come to school knowing what is required for success. Teaching students the skills for being successful in life is equally important as teaching them academic skills. When the skills, attitudes, and traits that are required for success are incorporated and deeply embedded in the school culture, students do not have to guess what they are.
- Guidelines for Success represent a set of skills, traits and attitudes that everyone in the school always strives to demonstrate. The guidelines are not rules- they are more like goals, lifelong learning strategies, or codes of conduct.




Buena Vista HS: Guidelines for Success



What has been the impact? More students attending school.


Chronic absenteeism, a part of the State's new accountability system, has decreased in grades 9 to 12.


What has been the impact? More students attending school by subgroup

Restorative Practices

Restorative Practices compliment the Safe and Civil Schools program. Restorative practices focus on repairing the harm and relationships rather than on punishment. Restorative Practices:

- Builds healthy relationships between staff and students
- Resolves conflict while holding student accountable
- Repairs harm and restores positive relationships
- Reduces, prevents and improves harmful behavior
