Purpose of the Presentation:

In January, 2016 a presentation on co-teaching was provided that addressed the following topics:

- Description of co-teaching and its benefits to students.
- History of co-teaching at grade levels: K-5; 6-8; 9-12.
- Support provided by Special Education.

What is Co-Teaching?

- A delivery model that offers different ways to provide quality services to students with special needs in the general education classroom.
- Increases differentiation in instruction to benefit all students.
- Provides two equally-qualified individuals who may or may not have the same area of expertise jointly delivering instruction to a group of students.

Purpose of Co-Teaching

- Provides the Least Restrictive Environment for students of all capabilities.
- Benefits special education students academically, socially, and emotionally.
- Allows access to differentiated strategies for all students.



What does research say?

Research with 124 students in both solo taught and co-taught classrooms found that grades were statistically improved for all co-taught classes.

History of Co-Teaching in PUSD

Prior to 2009

All support for Special Education provided in self contained classrooms

2009

Co-teaching implemented in math for Resource (RSP) students in grades 9-12

2010 - Present

Co-teaching expanded to 9-12 ELA and K-8 for RSP students

2014

Co-teaching pilot 9th grade SDC Science

2015

Co-teaching pilot 10th – 12th grade SDC Science


Current Year

RSP- all grades SDC- 9-12 Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry

Support for Co-Teaching


- Initial Professional Development by Dr. Wendy Murawski, expert in the field of co-teaching.
 - 37 co-teaching teams, 7 administrators and 5 coaches trained
- Quarterly class visits by Dr. Murawski for coaching and feedback.
 - Site and District Administrators, Specialists, Coaches, Teachers

Having two teachers is better because they both explain and put more understanding in the lesson.


10th grade student Paramount High School I feel like I have learned so much more because I'm in a co-taught class.

Co-Teaching: A Two Year Plan



■ Number of Students

- Class size remains the same
- 9-10 SDC students per co-taught class

Support for Co-Teaching

- In May, 2017 meetings with teachers at PHS took place to review co-teaching plan and provide support for addendums for students in co-teaching classrooms in 2017-18. Data on the positive impact of co-teaching was shared.
- In 2017-18, teachers will participate in 5 professional development days on curriculum planning and modification with Dr. Murawski. Teachers will be observed by Dr. Murawski and provided coaching support for lesson planning and delivery.

Next Steps

- Confirm co-teaching teams for 2017-18.
- Provide professional development for principals, coaches, and teacher teams.
- Monitor progress through observation and data collection (grades, graduation rates).
