Overview

- The Title I Parent Survey is given each year for the parents of students in grades K-12.
- In 2016-2017, one survey was administered with both LCAP and Title I sections- The combination of what had been two surveys in the prior year, made it easier for parents to participate
 - Compared to last year the LCAP return rate grew as a result.
 - Compared to last year the Title I return rate dropped as a result.
- Questions on the following topics were added to reflect district focus.
 - Student to Adult Connections
 - College and Career Readiness

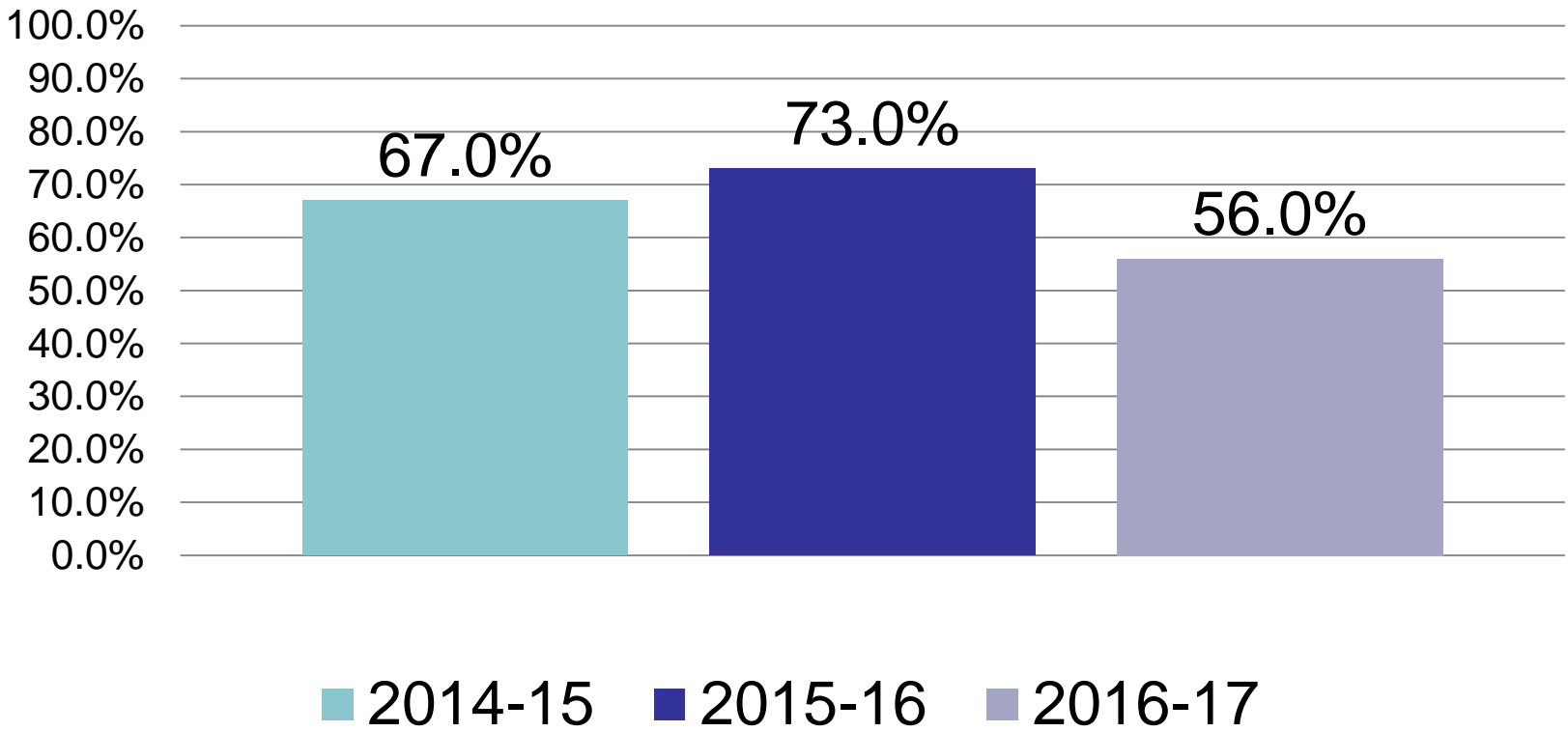

Although there was an overall decline in participation, response rate continues to be over 50%.

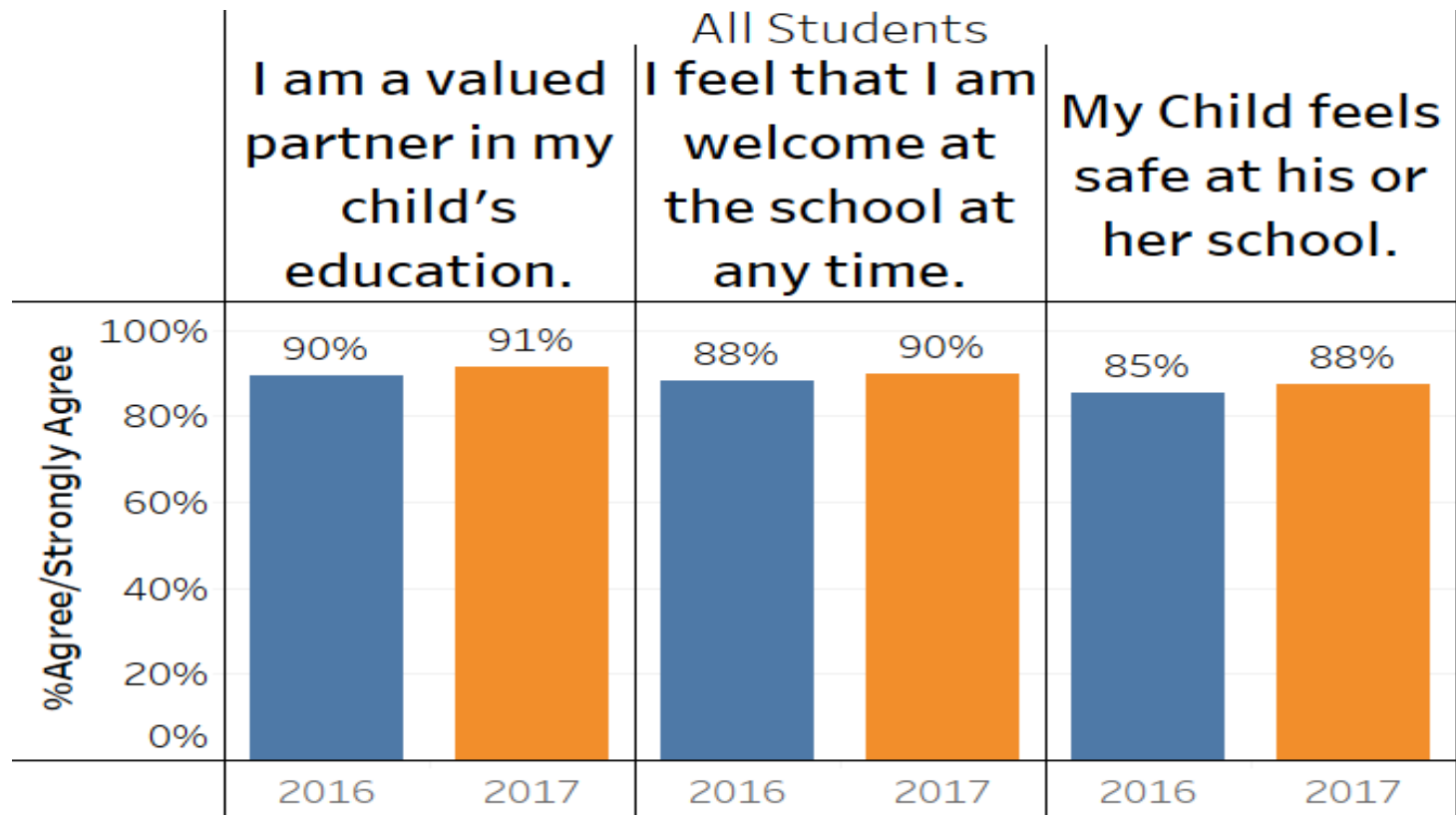
Title I Parent Survey Return Rates, 2015-17





School Climate & Engagement:K-12

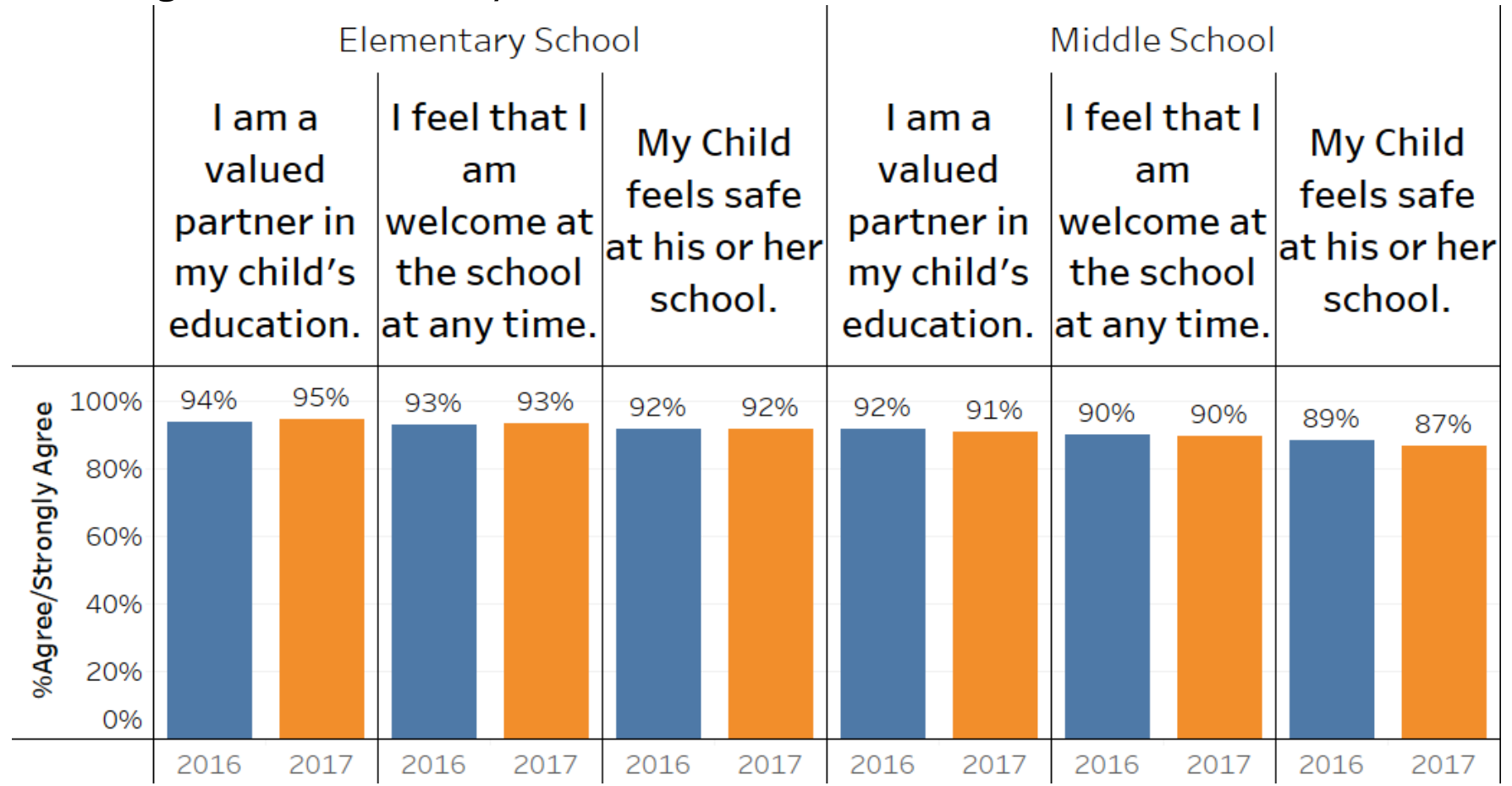
Parents continue to express a strong feeling of school safety and connectedness.





School Climate & Engagement:K-8

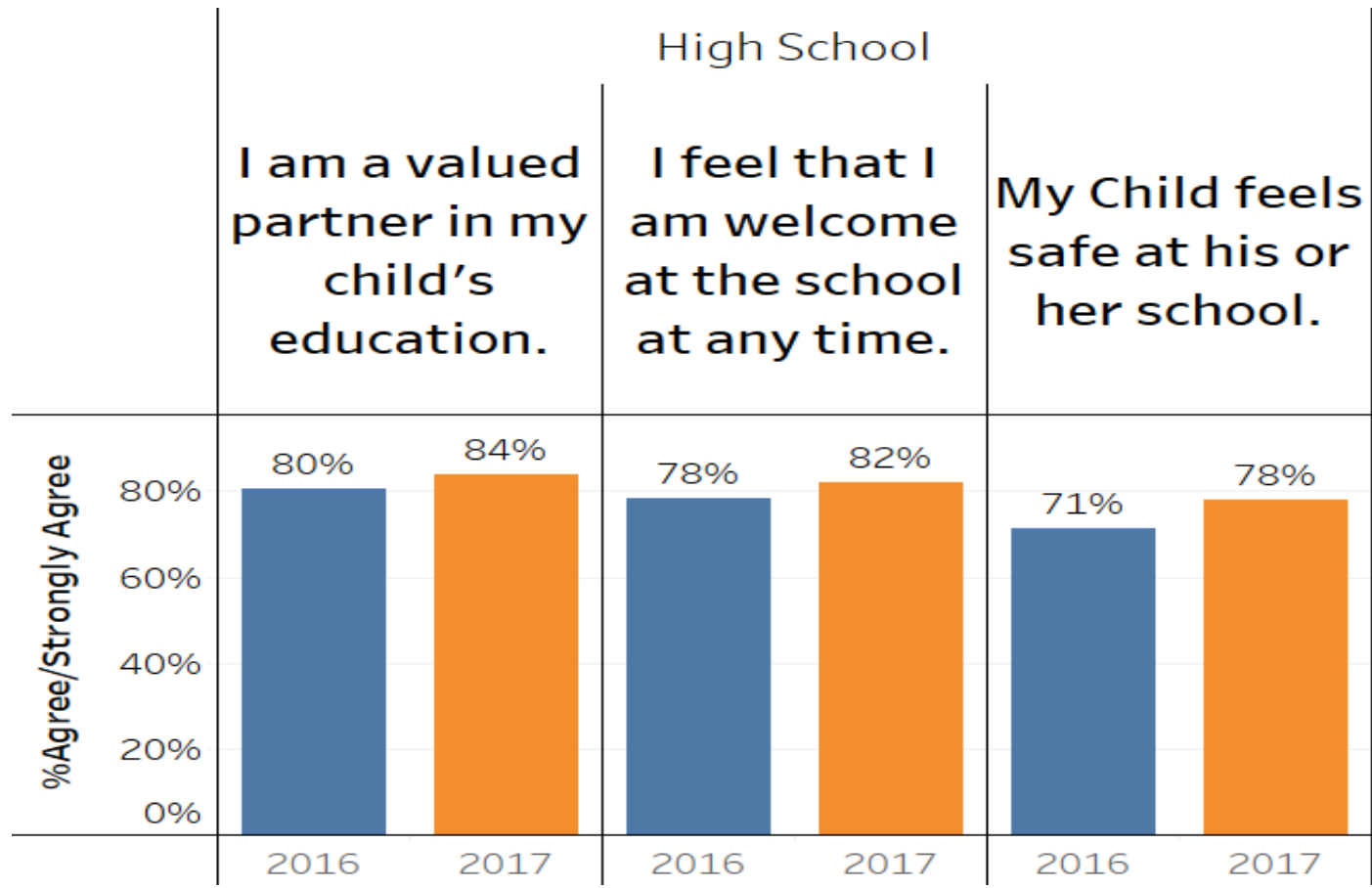
Elementary and middle school parents continue to express a strong feeling of school safety and connectedness.

Student to Adult Connections

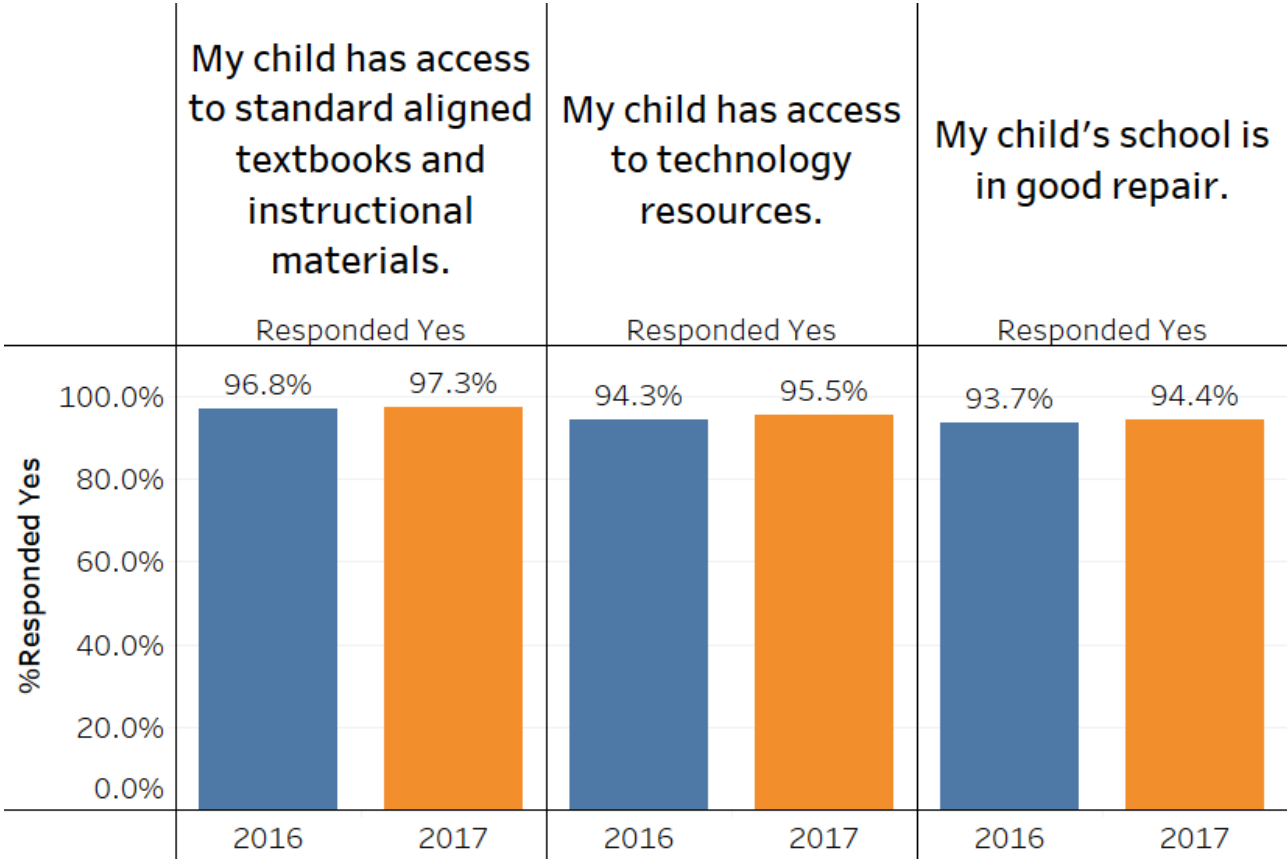
Parents report high levels of students feeling connected to adults.

Conditions of Learning

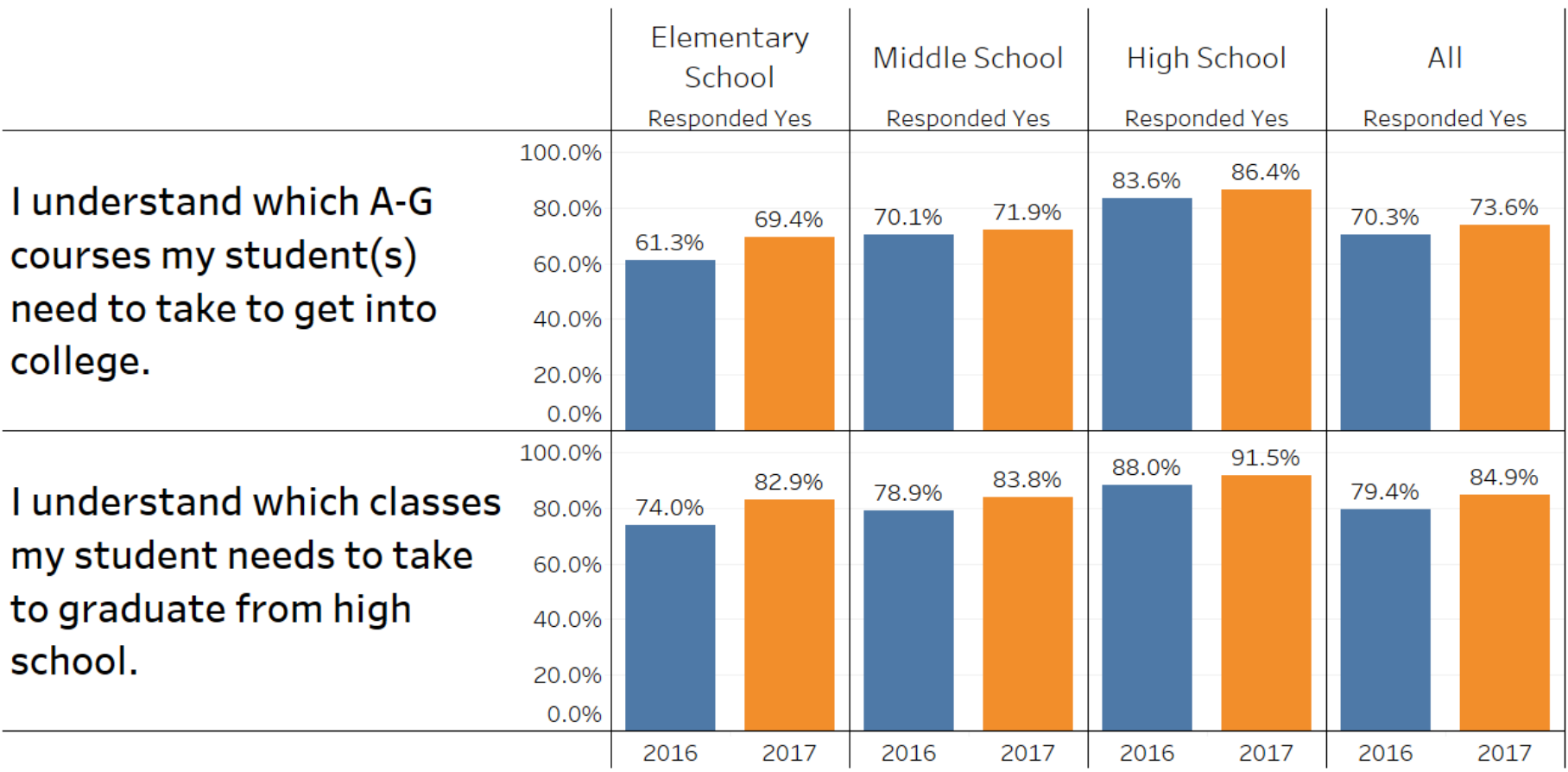
K-12 parents report high level of satisfaction with school facilities, materials, and technology.





College and Career Readiness

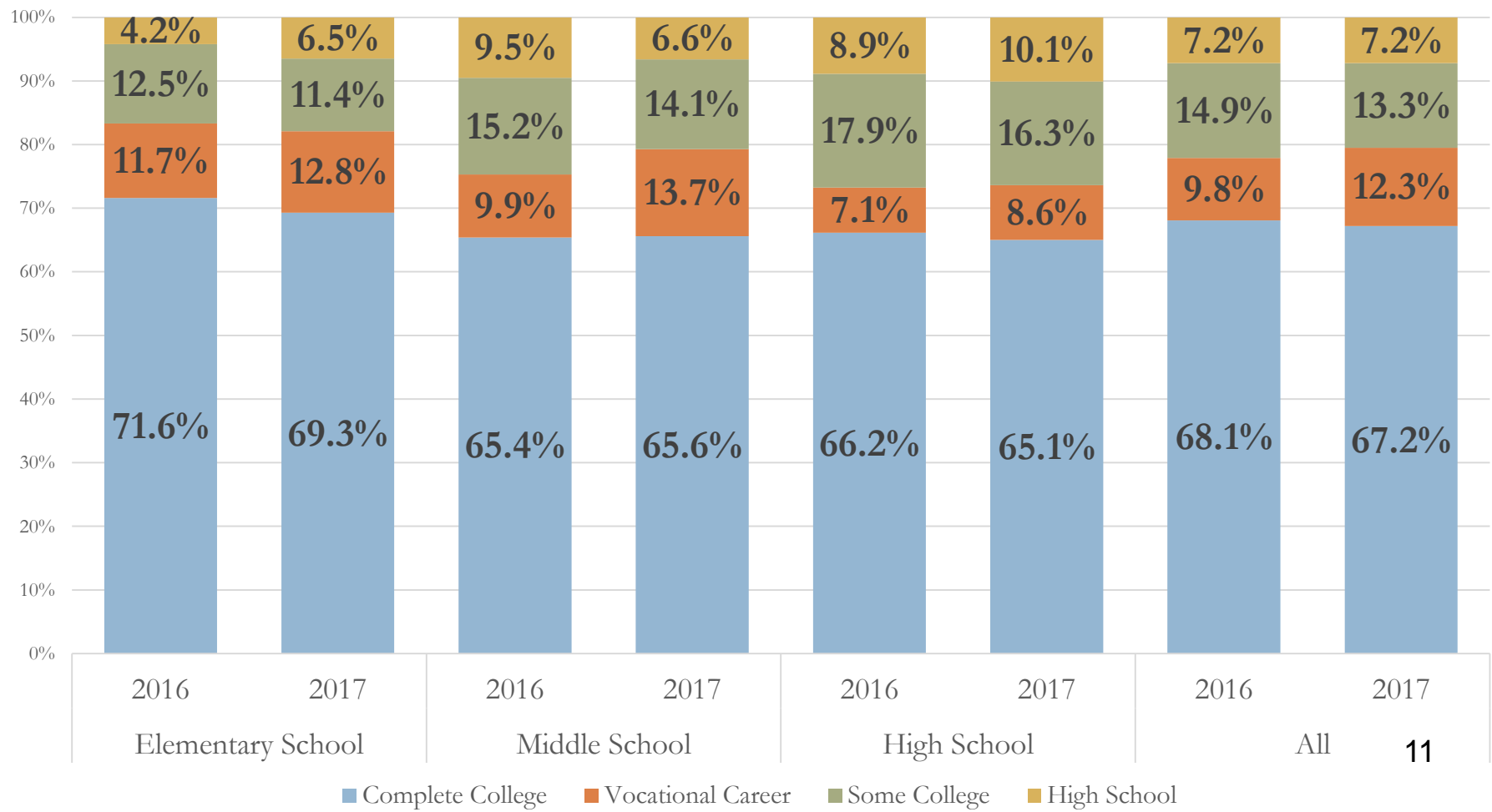
More parents understand A-G courses that are required enroll in college.
