Personal Contact and "Check-In" with High Needs Students

- Teams continue to make personal contact with parents of students in the Moderate-Severe Program
- Student supports are determined and provided based on need, in collaboration with school site teams and members of the special education department





PREPARING STUDENTS FOR COLLEGE AND CAREERS

Academic Tutoring and Support for Students with Special Needs

Additional academic support is determined and provided based on communication between school site team members, parents and/or students

Every school site provides academic supports:

Special Education teachers have daily *Office Hours* and/or dedicated asynchronous time to support students through tutoring, small group instruction, individualized academics related to IEP goals, and to collaborate with parents





PREPARING STUDENTS FOR COLLEGE AND CAREERS

Support at Every Level

- Supplemental resources through drop off or pick up
- Regular contact with families to check on services
- My Tutor; Khan Academy; Homework Club; Study Hall; Learning Strategies Management class; Transitional Management class
- Before/After school tutoring group; intervention groups; recorded lessons; tutorial videos

- Tutoring support discussions at every IEP and student conference




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Celebrating Integration at School Sites
