
# California School Reopening Framework and Public Health Guidance

<ul> <li>Schools serving students in K-6 can resume in-person instruction</li> <li>The state considers grade 6 to be an "elementary" grade level, not a "middle school" grade level</li> <li>Requires a COVID Safety Plan (CSP) on its website for 5 days prior to reopening</li> <li>CSP must be submitted for state approval</li> <li>It is "strongly recommended" that districts consult labor, parent, and community organizations. ## AB/SB 86: Key Provisions

- Provides \$6.6 billion total to districts
- \$4.6 billion for addressing the effects of COVID-19
- Recommended use of the funds include:
  - > Diagnostic assessments and other progress monitoring tools
  - **≻**Tutoring
  - > Learning recovery programs and materials
  - > Educator training
  - >Supports to address other barriers to learning
  - ➤ Community learning hubs
- \$2 billion in incentive funding for schools to reopen under conditions

# AB/SB 86: Incentive Funding

- Not a mandate to reopen schools
- Paramount's potential share of incentive funding: RUBEN
- For districts in the Purple Tier:
  - ➤ Reopen for in-person instruction in grades TK-2
  - ➤ Offer in-person instruction to all students in "prioritized groups" at all grade levels
  - >Asymptomatic testing for students and staff, unless reopening plan adopted by March 31
- For districts in the Red Tier:
  - ➤ Reopen for in-person instruction in grades TK-5
  - > Reopen for in-person instruction in "at least one" MS and at "least one" HS grade
  - ➤ Asymptomatic testing not required
- April 1 deadline to receive the full amount of incentive funds
  - Loss of 1% of funding each instructional day after if provisions not met
  - ➤ Spring break does not count
  - Loss of all funding if provisions not met by May 15

# **Options**

Advantages:	<ul> <li>Offers Consistency in instructional program</li> <li>Least amount of disruption</li> <li>Minimal risk of COVID-19 transmission</li> <li>No delay in implementation</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>District will receive all or a percentage of AB/SB 86 incentive funds</li> <li>Allows students an in-person learning option in grades K-2 while in purple tier; grades 3-5 and at least one MS and HS grade when in red tier</li> <li>Provides in-person support for prioritized student groups in all grades</li> <li>Offers parents who want an in-person option a choice at several grade levels</li> <li>Allows parents who want to stay with distance learning to do so</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Would allow for a reopening plan that best fits PUSD's specific needs</li> <li>Could build upon the work accomplished by the BTS Taskforce</li> <li>Could include gradual reopening process that includes cohorts for prioritized groups and/or in-person instruction at certain grade levels</li> </ul>
Things to Consider:	<ul> <li>Loss of all AB/SB 86 incentive funds</li> <li>In-person instruction not taking place for students who need it the most</li> <li>Parents who prefer in-person instruction do not have an alternative</li> <li>Other districts may offer in-person instruction</li> <li>Susceptible to litigation</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Risk of COVID-19 transmission</li> <li>Vaccinations very likely not completed for staff before starting</li> <li>Negotiations required with TAP and CSEA</li> <li>Will take several weeks to implement (mid-April start likely)</li> <li>Susceptible to litigation</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Loss of all AB/SB 86 incentive funds</li> <li>Risk of COVID-19 transmission if plan includes any in-person instruction options</li> <li>Vaccinations very likely not completed for staff before starting any in-person instruction options</li> <li>Negotiations required with TAP and CSEA</li> <li>Will take several weeks to implement (mid-April start likely)</li> <li>Local districts will likely reopen according to provisions of AB/SB 86</li> <li>Susceptible to litigation</li> </ul>

#### Reopening Grades TK-5

- Post CSP to website and submit to state for approval
- Finalize in-person and distance learning schedules
  - ➤ Will a hybrid schedule be necessary to maintain distancing?
    - If not, 5 days per week for students choosing in-person option is possible
  - ➤ Schedule must include time for teachers to support those who continue with distance learning to avoid teacher changes
- Parents would need to indicate their choice of instructional model
- Review protocols and guidelines with staff
- Review protocols and guidelines with students and parents
- Ensure all PPE is in place and available
- Ensure transportation is available

#### In-Person Support for Prioritized Student Groups

- Needed at grade levels that do not have an in-person option as well as Moderate/Severe special education courses
- Post CSP to website and submit to state for approval
- Finalize format
  - ➤ Moderate/Severe special education courses can follow BTS model
  - > Can use existing time in current distance learning schedules for this
- Parents would need to indicate willingness to participate
- Review protocols and guidelines with staff
- Review protocols and guidelines with students and parents
- Ensure all PPE is in place and available
- Ensure transportation is available

### Reopening at Middle School and High School

- Determine which MS and HS grade(s) can return for in-person instruction
  - ➤ At least one MS grade and one HS grade
- Post CSP to website and submit to state for approval
- Finalize in-person and distance learning schedules
  - >Schedule will likely be a hybrid schedule with block periods that alternate days
  - ➤ Schedule must include time for teachers to support those who continue with distance learning to avoid teacher changes
- Parents would need to indicate their choice of instructional model
- Review protocols and guidelines with staff
- Review protocols and guidelines with students and parents
- Ensure all PPE is in place and available
- Ensure transportation is available
