- **Both programs include support for social-emotional learning and English Learners**
- **Six weeks total, split into two three-week sessions (June 14-July 22)**
- **Courses held Monday-Thursday Time: 8:30-11:45**
- **14:1 student to teacher ratio in-person**
- **Offered at four sites – Lincoln, Wirtz, Los Cerritos, Collins and online program**
- **Transportation available for qualified students.**

- Six weeks total, split into two three-week sessions (June 14-July 22) Time: 9:00-12:00
- Courses held Monday-Thursday
- 14:1 student to teacher ratio in-person
- Open to all students
- 3 Classes:
 - ✓ Student Success Class
 - ✓ Math
 - ✓ Enrichment
- Social emotional lessons embedded in curriculum

In addition to the offerings for elementary and middle school students described above, we will be working with the STAR program to offer services each afternoon for those students as needed.

High School

Credit recovery, enrichment, specialized student support and Extended School Year for special education students in accordance with their IEP's.

Locations: Buena Vista High School, Odyssey STEM Academy, Paramount Community Day School, Paramount High School-West Campus, Paramount High School-Senior Campus

- In-person instruction (14:1 in accordance with CDC guidelines), synchronous instruction (virtual/distance learning) and online credit recovery (Edgenuity) for courses required for graduation
 - Summer bridge for incoming 9th graders: ELA & Math
 - Enrichment and Credit Recovery
 - Extended School Year for special education students in accordance with their IEP's
 - AB288 Dual Enrollment (Compton College Cohorts #1, #2 & #3)
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- New CTE Entrepreneurship Biz Camp (Enrichment)
 - Odyssey STEM Academy will go an additional week long this year
 - Edgenuity offerings will expand to four consecutive days per week (Monday-Thursday) with an hour of office hour support available on Friday's
 - Kahn Academy recommendations by grade level/subject to support learning loss
 - Expansion to 11 AP Prep courses to build study skill levels in Fall AP courses
 - Dual enrollment will consist of Compton College AB288 Cohorts #1,#2 and #3.
 - Expansion of our efforts to assist graduates with their transition to college through counselor support: "Summer Melt" prevention

Additional Service: Decreasing “Summer Melt”

Summer melt is the phenomenon of prospective college students' motivation to attend college "melting" away during the summer between the end of high school and beginning of college. Students who qualify for college and in some cases even register for classes ultimately end up not attending college because they lack resources, support, guidance, and encouragement.

What is ESY (Extended School Year)?

Extended School Year (ESY) services are special education and related services that are provided to a child with a disability. These services are different from summer school. Summer school is an extension of the regular school year available to any student attending the school. ESY services are special education and related services that a student must qualify for and are in accordance with the student's IEP.

Legal Guidelines *34 CFR §300.106 states the following about ESY services:*

Each public agency must ensure that extended school year services are available as necessary to provide FAPE.

Extended school year services must be provided if a child's IEP team determines, on an individual basis, that the services are necessary for the provision of FAPE to the child.

General Guidelines

The key question before the IEP team is whether the child needs ESY services in order to secure the minimum benefits of a free and appropriate public education during the regular school year.

ESY services do not need to duplicate the services provided during the school year because the purpose is different (prevent regression rather than continued progression). A student may require ESY services in only one area (e.g. speech and language) but not in other areas (e.g. specialized academic instruction).

The IEP team considers the student's current placement in order to avoid placing the student in a more or less restrictive environment for ESY services.

ESY (Extended School Year Services):

- Curriculum: Students identified Mild/Moderate access the general education curriculum with appropriate accommodations/modifications. Summer school for students identified Mild/Moderate typically focuses on developing skills for students at risk or allowing students to regain credits.
- Students identified Moderate/Severe access the Unique Learning System (ULS) summer curriculum. The Summer Thematic Units address science, geography, and transition skills through differentiated daily lessons and activities. Lessons integrate practical transition and life skills from preschool through Adult Transition. Lessons also include news activities to help students make connections between what they are studying and current events. The curriculum involves daily routines, structured schedules, and school-to-home connections to engage families in their students' learning.
- All Students identified Special Needs will have access to schoolwide activities/events/assemblies scheduled within the general education setting on site.

What's Next?

- Registration through School Mint
