Principal Lisa Nunley and students Graciela Frias and Asia Abram presented an overview of the Boardroom bulletin boards representing Jackson School student work. The bulletin boards reflect the theme of "Jackson Knight's Life" enhancing the educational message sent to visitors and District office employees.

<u>City of Paramount – PHS Sculpture Photo Donation</u>

Mr. John Moreno, Assistant City Manager for the City of Paramount presented the Board with a donation of a framed photo piece of the Sculpture that is displayed outside the PHS Delores Stephens Library. The Sculpture is titled "Poetry In Motion" and contains an inscription by

T.S. Eliot "What we call the beginning is often the end. And to make an end is to make a beginning. The end is where we start from."

Community Service Graduation Requirement Update

The purpose of the presentation is to provide the Board with an update on the progress of the Community Service Graduation Requirement.

Mr. Manuel San Miguel, Director-Alternative Education reported that one of the first things the Task Force completed was a decision analysis. The Task Force also reviewed and analyzed neighboring district programs, established PUSD guidelines and drafted a PUSD document.

Mr. San Miguel further explained how community service meets the District's vision of community engagement. Students experience connections between academics and real life situations, all stakeholders are provided an opportunity to be involved with students, all stakeholders begin to develop and share a common vision of high expectations for all students, networking among businesses, community, and students is provided and relationships are established between businesses, community and, students.

The community service graduation requirement guidelines include:

- Students are required to complete 30 hours of community service beginning with the class of 2015
- Students are strongly encouraged to complete all required hours by their junior year
- Students who wish to earn a community service graduation CORD must complete at least 100 hours of community service
- New students who enroll from out of the district will be required to meet only hours suggested for the grades they need to complete
- All students can become involved in their community through community projects and volunteer opportunities
- Service must be an activity that benefits other people or the environment directly
- Students cannot be paid or receive school credit for the service they provide
- The individuals or organization students are working for cannot profit monetarily from the service
- Service must be before, during lunch, or after school hours to qualify for credit

The fiscal impact would be for the cost of releasing two teachers for two periods each day. This would include one teacher at PHS-Senior and one teacher at PHS-West with a stipend position at Buena Vista High School.

The Community Service Graduation Requirement project plan next steps are to seek Board approval on February 23, 2011. It will also revise the Board policy to reflect the Community Service plan, it will create a communication plan for parents, students and staff, review school documentation for revision, and ensure communication to all stakeholders. The Implementation of the new Community Service graduation requirement will take place September 2011 and it will gather data, evaluate program progress and report to the Board of Education in June 2012.
