Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Mendez highlighted a variety of items:

- Superintendent Mendez met with students at Paramount High School and engaged them in questions that will assist him with his Look, Listen and Learn system.
- Mr. Mendez attended the Annual 33rd District PTA Principals & Presidents Conference.
- He shared with the Board that the Annual MESA Kick-Off is scheduled for Saturday, October 19 at Paramount High School.

Thinking Maps: A Common Core Approach to Writing

Dr. Deborah Stark, Assistant Superintendent-Educational Services shared with the Board that in her presentation, she would provide an overview of what Thinking Maps are and how students benefit from them, outline the District's two year plan to improve student writing and the role of Thinking Maps and provide example of our student's use of Thinking Maps.

The Common Core Standards and new assessments that begin in 2014-15 have a much greater emphasis on critical thinking and writing. To address these needs, PUSD has begun a two year implementation of a writing program that is aligned to the Common Core Standards-*Write from the Beginning and Beyond*. This program is based on the use of Thinking Maps as a foundation for students to plan and organize their writing.

In August 2013, Thinking Maps Lead Teachers representing every K-5 and 6-8 school participated in three days of training to become Thinking Maps Trainers. In September and October, these Lead Teachers trained all K-5 and 6-8 Core teachers on the use of Thinking Maps. Teachers attended with their grade

level or content area (ie, all 2nd grade teachers, all middle school science teachers).

Thinking Maps are a language of eight visual patterns based on fundamental thinking processes. These patterns are used across grade levels and curriculum areas to promote critical thinking and writing.

Our ability to learn visually is greater than any of our other senses. 80% of what comes into our brain is visual. By connecting a visual design with a specific thought process, students create mental visual patterns that promote thinking, helping them become independent critical thinkers. Students who use Thinking Maps learn what thinking looks like.

Maps reflects eight (8) cognitive processes: defining in context, describing, comparing and contrasting, classifying, part to whole relationships, sequencing, cause and effect and seeing analogies.

The District's next steps include:

- By the end of October 2013, all K-5 teachers and 6-8 teachers of Language arts, math, social studies and science will have participated in a full day of Thinking Maps training. Thinking Maps Lead Teachers will participate in five days of advanced level training to develop their expertise.
- K-8 teachers will implement the use of the Maps across content areas. Students will use them to develop oral and written language skills.
- Teams of principals and coaches will visit every K-8 school to observe evidence of the implementation of Thinking Maps and Common Core Standards.
- In summer 2014, Lead Teachers will attend five days of professional development on Write from the Beginning, which uses Thinking Maps as the foundation for writing. These Lead Teachers will provide this same writing training to all K-8 teachers in 2014-15.
- By the end of 2015, all K-8 classes will use Thinking Maps and Write from the Beginning to develop students' thinking and writing.
