The goal of the Gates scholarship is to promote academic excellence and to provide an opportunity for outstanding minority students with significant financial need to reach their highest potential.

<u>MESA</u>

MESA (Math, Engineering, Science Achievement) is an organization whose mission is to provide middle and high school students with hands on science, math and engineering experience with the goal of inspiring them to pursue college studies in these subjects. The Board of Education members and Superintendent Mendez recognized the MESA students from Paramount High School, Paramount High School-West, Alondra School, Jackson School, Hollydale School, Paramount Park School, and Zamboni School on their successful performance at the regional competition this year. During this event, they competed against students from districts throughout Los Angeles County.

Introduction: Gregoire Francois-Principal

Dr. Greg Francois received his Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from the University of California Santa Barbara, his Masters Degree in Multicultural Education from California State University Dominguez Hills and his Doctorate from the University of Southern California in Educational Leadership.

For the past seven years, Greg has served as an Assistant Principal at Paramount High School. Greg has overseen the areas of Curriculum & Instruction, Attendance, Guidance and Special Education. Greg is highly regarded and is known for being a hard worker, organized and dedicated to students.

Dr. Francois addressed the Board and wished to extend a thank you to the Board for providing him the opportunity and looks forward to leading, inspiring the families and community, teachers and students at Jackson School. We welcome Greg as Principal of Jackson School.

LCAP Presentation

Dr. Deborah Stark, Assistant Superintendent-Educational Services shared with the Board that the purpose of the presentation is to review how collaborative planning time is described in the LCAP, options for providing time in grades K-5, review the process that will be used to plan collaborative planning time in grades 6-8 and support that will be provided during transition year.

The LCAP requires that all activities and services be connected to student learning outcomes. Time provided for teachers needs to be part of a research based practice to improve student learning. This can include professional development, collaborative planning and instruction through teacher specialists (P.E., music).

In grade K-5, the District will provide music, PE, and technology instruction to students while teams of teachers participate in grade level collaboration and planning. Four P.E. teachers, 3 music teachers and 12 computer lab aides will be hired. This model can be implemented in 2014-15. One example, music, PE teachers and technology aides provide instruction to three classes at a time. Students spend 20-30 minutes learning music, participating in PE and learning computer skills, rotating between the three classes. A visiting team of music and PE teachers spend specific days at a school.

What will the impact be on student learning:

- Increased scores on fifth grade Physical Fitness test
- Pre and post test on typing skills
- Pre and post test on music skills and knowledge

The process for Plan implementation at the 6-8 level includes:

- Task force will be convened to address two goals for grade 6-8
- Delivery options for collaborative planning time
- Academic interventions during the school day (for students failing or in danger of failing)
- Task force will visit schools in other districts with intervention schedules, develop recommendations for implementing planning time and academic interventions in 2015-16.
- Items that require negotiations will be addressed through the negotiation process.

Transition support for 2014-15 will include funds to provide site based time for professional development and collaborative planning. This will support grades 6-8 during the planning year. Funds will be allocated based on number of teachers at each school. Options include substitute release time, hourly compensation. Schools will submit a plan on how they will use funds and measure impact.
