Program Purpose

- Provide effective leadership at each of our school sites
- Develop future leaders within our current staff
- Provide in-house mentors to aspiring leaders to be prepared when openings at our schools arise





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Protégé Participants

The targeted program participants are: Assistant Principals Deans Curriculum Specialists Program Specialists Instructional Coaches TOSAs





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Participant Requirements

- Administrative Credential eligibility
- Current position out of the classroom
- Minimum of 5 years of successful teaching experience



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Principal Mentors

- Possess 5 years principal experiences
- Positive evaluations that reflect strong leadership
- Effective implementation of an innovative program
- Stipend will be provided





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Program Design

The program is designed to address the California Professional Standards for Educational Leaders

Standard 1:Develop, articulate and implement a vision for learning.Standard 2:Nurture and sustain a school culture and instructional
program conducive to student learning and professional
growth.

Standard 3: Ensure a safe, effective learning environment.

Standard 4: Promote the success of all students by collaborating with families and community members, responding to diverse community interests and needs.





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Program Format

• The program includes three types of learning experiences:

Professional Discussions, in which the mentor principal describes their experience with a topic, how they went about addressing it as a new leader and what they have learned as a result of their experience. These discussions include time for the aspiring leader to ask questions.

On Site Visits/Shadowing, in which the mentor principal and aspiring leader visit classrooms and walk the site to see evidence of the focus question being studied.

Group Meetings, which provide the opportunity for group discussion and reflection on a specific topic.




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Pilot Program Timeline
