Bulletin Boards - Collins School

Theresa Diaz, Principal Collins School wished to thank Vice President Cuarenta for her advocacy on behalf of the Collins School Garden. Theresa Diaz, Principal-Collins School along with the assistance from students Luis Guzman, Marlene Guzman, Jurnie Pablo, Victoria Reyes, presented an overview of the Boardroom bulletin boards representing Collins School's educational program and student work. The bulletin boards reflect the theme of "Collins Colts' Mantra" and enhance the educational message sent to visitors and District office employees.

Theresa Diaz, Principal Collins School wished to thank Vice President Cuarenta for her advocacy on behalf of the Collins School Garden.

Principal Keith Nuthall, Dean Becky Perez, and with the assistance of students Tevin Dunbar, Yasdell Rios, and Andres Salcedo provided the Board with an update on Odyssey STEM Academy. Mr. Nuthall spoke about inclusion, provided included the power of the scholar ideas, school and society, Leaving to Learn, NuVu Studio, and an ethic of excellence. Mr. Nuthall shared that at Odyssey, there are walls that are known as Advisory Walls and on these wall students identify their personality traits, their interests and their skills. As the years go by, you will be able to see these interests and traits and the students can view who they are. These walls represent the positive lives of Odyssey's Scholars. Odyssey scholars Tevin, Yasdell and Andres spoke about their possible lives. Scholars also provided the Board and Executive Cabinet with books that were referenced during their presentation.

Environmental Update

Mr. Ruben Frutos, Assistant Superintendent-Business Services provided the Board with an Environmental update that included a review of the Districts actions since the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) identified air quality issues in this City of Paramount, bring the Board up to date on some of the processes and information that has served as information since the last update, District funding grants and where to go from here (next steps).

There was discussion on the following: The District is not moving forward when we are going and retracting information that Mr. Frutos has already presented (De Leon), how are you going to bid, when someone is going to give you the money (De Leon), when our attorney is referred, is that Jim Romo or what attorney (De Leon), a concern that the law firm has given superintendents' mortgage loans (De Leon), page 16 references that in January 2020 staff is seeking grants, it is known that IQ Air has been seeking grants for us (De Leon), what are we going to do, when will all the paperwork get done (De Leon), how often does the Environmental Subcommittee meet (De Leon), request for the attorney's contract information to see who the attorney represents (De Leon), slide 14 Zamboni School- will it be retrofitted for this amount, where does this amount fall into (Gomez), Gaines Elementary - will there be a hold up because of the difference in amount (Gomez), do we still have to bid out for the services (Gomez), how much longer do we have to wait, how much more does it take for us to get on this (Gomez), when will bids go out, what is the timeframe (Hansen), a request for a report back on the bid process to be provided at the April meeting (Hansen), was information about purchasing HEPA filters at a discount from someone provided by Mrs. De Leon (Hansen), does each machine take two filters (Hansen), should the district move forward with getting filters into the machines in the classrooms that are not part of the grant, a consensus from the Board was requested - there was consensus (Hansen), information on the provider for the HEPA filters was provided to Dr. Perez (De Leon), a request for the number of HVAC units that each school has (Gomez), clarification was requested for next steps with IQ Air (Gomez), can we come back to the Board and see how we can put air filters in other schools without grant money (Gomez), do we know when the application for the other two grants mentioned are due (Gomez), when will we find out if we qualify for the other grants (Gomez), grants have to come back to the Board for approval (Hansen), do we know when that's going to happen to bring back to the Board (Gomez), it was asked that IQ Air send the district a copy of the grant to Ruben, have we received it yet (Hansen), how are we moving forward after what has been said (Gomez).

Nancy with IQ Air provided comment that because there is no school board approval on the grant, they had to take the application back because the Board has to approve. She understands the bidding process, but that is not what they do as a foundation. She asked that the District tell her how they would like to proceed and she will take it back to her CEO.

9. COMMUNICATIONS/DISCUSSION

Discussion: 9.1 Assembly Bill 272 - Student Smartphone Use

Board Member Gomez shared that AB 272 authorizes school Boards to make a policy to either limit or to not have students have their cell phones during school hours with the exception of emergencies. She shared that she did some research that in Escondido they have pouches that are hung on the front door and when students come in, they hang their cell phone there. The other research she did was in San Mateo where they put a pouch under lock and no students can use them during school hours. Board member Gomez recommended that the Board make policy but pilot a program for one of the grade levels. They will not have their cell phones in class, but can use their phones in between classes because that is their freedom. In class, they should not be used because statistically, it is showing that the student will improve in his schoolwork if they do not have their cell phone. What do we do as a district to help our students get ahead? The pros, she believes the scores will be higher, the cons are we will have parents upset.

There was Discussion/questions on the following; there are different procedures throughout the different schools, the need to find out what the schools are doing (Hansen), a request to see if CSBA has something that we can build on (Hansen), what policy or rules are given by the district (De Leon) what do we have for the high school (De Leon) are they allowed to use phones or they not allowed to use phones (De Leon), phones allowed during break and lunch (Hansen), does a teacher follow through, is admin helping them follow through (De Leon), a request for Dr. Pérez to do a little research and come back to the Board with some recommendations (Hansen), posibility of piloting one class in each grade level in one middle school (Gomez), a great idea to start at the middle school and then those middle school students are going to be familiar with it (De Leon), data is need on the safety of the pouches (Garcia), a need to make policy that they're not allowed to take it out at all

during class hours or even lunch (Gomez), more information was requested to be brought back so a decision can be made (Hansen).

There was discussion on the following: are we doing anything about translating the agenda into Spanish for the community (Gomez), a request to post the translated agenda on-line. Can we bring back AB5 next month, what is the Board's plan for AB 5, do we have employees that are independent contractors that are doing the business (Gomez), a request for some research to be done and sent home on a Wednesday report (Hansen/Gomez), if needed it can be discussed at the next meeting (Gomez).
