Goal #3: Create a safe and civil learning environment for all stakeholders that incorporates restorative practices


Goal #4: All school facilities will be clean, orderly, well maintained, and modern


Using a Range of Approaches for Creating Positive School Climate


- Safe and Civil Schools at all elementary and middle schools; highlight on Mokler Elementary School.

- **Breaking Down the Walls** at Jackson and PHS Senior Campus; highlight on PHS Senior Campus.


Mokler's Guidelines for Success

Guidelines for Success are a set of skills, traits, and attitudes that everyone in the school strives to demonstrate.









Mokler's School Procedures for Common Areas

A common area is a school setting where students are supervised by a variety of staff members. These settings include:

- Hallways
- Restrooms
- Cafeteria
- Playground
- School Entry and Exit Areas

Positive School-wide Expectations Entering Cafeteria

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To provide students with safe and orderly procedures as they enter the cafeteria.

Guidelines for Safety:

- Students are expected to walk in a single-file-line escorted by their classroom teacher.
- Students are expected to remain on the designated yellow line until directed by the staff to enter the cafeteria.

Student Procedures:

- Students will enter the cafeteria directed by supervising adult staff.
- Students will choose a lunch tray, enter the cafeteria to select a drink item, and then punch in their lunch number.
- · Students will go to the salad bar to choose selected food options.
- Students will then walk to their designated lunch table.

Teacher Expectations:

- Teachers are to teach students cafeteria procedures the first week of school.
 Along with explicitly re-teaching procedures quarterly and revisit as needed.
- Noon-duty-aides will walk around and monitor students while their eating lunch.
- Students are to remain seated at their lunch table, throwing away their lunch tray in recycling bins or being dismissed for recess.

Supervision Responsibility:

Adult staff will walk around the cafeteria to monitor student behavior.

Positive Encouragement includes positive feedback:

- "We don't run in the Mokler Café",
- "Thank you for cleaning your area".
- "Please use voice level 2."

Correction Procedures include:

- Restate the expectation that students are to remain seated while eating.
- Restate students are to walk in the café.
- Remind students to clean their designated table

Severe misbehavior: Notify an administrator via a referral or a phone call to the office



Relationships and Support at Paramount Park Middle School

Panther Academy: A Leadership Academy

- Elective class for referred 6th, 7th, 8th grade students
- Social-emotional learning, behavior and academic support
- Includes content, cross-curricular support, community building, study skills
- Teacher collaboration and student advocacy
- Teacher survey: "I wish all students had this type of support."
- Student survey: "Reason that I come to school."



Relationships and Support at Paramount Park Middle School

Mentoring: Awareness, Action Plans, Accountability


- Supports students with multiple D or F grades
- 1st Semester: Identification, Level I interventions
- 2nd Semester: Mentor Assigned; School-wide Approach
- Creates a Bridge between Parent, Student, School
- Ensures Students Access Resources; Teaches Self-Advocacy

Capturing Kids Hearts at PHS West

- Increased connection between teachers & students
- Increased connection among staff
- Student to student accountability
- Decrease in discipline referrals

Engaging Parents: Elementary and Middle Schools

Counselors and Social Workers provide parent training on topics related to socialemotional health at elementary and middle schools.

Mokler School

- Training on goal setting, importance of good attendance and Guidelines for Success.
- LA County Mental Health Department provided sessions on:
 - What is mental health?
 - Symptoms and treatment for depression; dealing with grief and loss.

Paramount Park

- Monthly meetings on topics, including goal setting, mental health, social media awareness.
- Social worker connects parents with local service agencies for mental health resources, homelessness support, food donations.

Engaging Parents: High School

Paramount High School – West Campus

- "Coffee Cup" meetings focused on school climate and culture and safety.
- Social Workers, Counselors, Administrators and other team members participate.
- Frequent outreach by Social Worker and Counselors
- Pirate Parent Crew

Paramount High School – Senior Campus

- "Parent Corner" meetings focused on parent-driven topics like vaping, raising teenagers, and social media.
- LACOE Community Schools workshops for parents.
- Regular updates via digital newsletters, Schoology posts, and phone calls.
