

Why Theme-Based Schools?

• Offers unique, relevant and motivating learning experiences that tap into students' interests and are specific to these schools:

Los Cerritos: Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA)

Jefferson: Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM)

- Supports STEM and VAPA Pathways in middle and high school.
- Has long term potential to attract students from other districts that do not offer these programs.

Los Cerritos Elementary: Visual and Performing Arts, 2019-20

Los Cerritos currently offers:

- PS Arts provides coaching and co-teaching to integrate drama in content areas in 4th and 5th grades.
- Art instruction during collaboration rotations. Art Masters provides art instruction for all K-2 classes.
- AMAN Dancing provides dance instruction focusing on grade 3.
- Music instruction for all grade levels every other week.
- Harmony Project provides after school and Saturday instrumental instruction for interested 4th and 5th grade students.





Los Cerritos Elementary: Visual and Performing Arts, 2020-21

 Add PS Arts Coaching to an additional two grade levels with a focus on embedding drama into Social Studies and Language Arts

 Add an extra grade level to participate in Art Masters

 Use existing K-5 Music Teacher to provide two additional days of music instruction every week.

- Provide Conga Kids Dance for 5th grade
- Offer Visual and Performing Arts Field Trips




Projected Cost and Funding

Jefferson Elementary Science, Technology, Engineering & Math, 2020-21

- Increase Science Education Center Presentations, Labs, and Activities to four sessions
- Implement new science adoption, Twig Science.
- Provide After School Mad Science classes and Mad Science Family Nights.
- Provide Science-based field trips.

November 2019

- Visit to Juarez

- Team debriefed the visit and began brainstorming for Theme-Based Schools in PUSD

January 2020

- Awareness meeting with principals, Educational Services and Human Resources
- Principals from the two schools met with various groups for input and feedback: SSC, ELAC, PTA, Leadership

February 2020

- Theme-Based Schools concept and plan shared with K- 5 principals.
- Principals from the two schools continued to meet with staff for input and feedback.
- Brochures planned and printed.

March 2020

- Develop implementation plan for 2020-21
- Share plan with DELAC and LCAP Committee
- Informational meetings with school and local community
- Disseminate brochures at Open House
- Activities on hold due to closure
