



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## An Opportunity for More Support: USC's College Advising Corps

- Established in 2013-2014
- The mission of the USC College Advising Corps is to improve college outcomes for low-income, first-generation, and underrepresented students
- The goal of the program is to raise the number of California students who attend and complete college by encouraging and assisting high school students with their college searches, college applications, financial aid, and making the transition to postsecondary education
- Partnership provides schools with a full-time college advisor
- Advisors are recent college graduates, trained and monitored by USC in partnership with school/district staff



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## An Opportunity for More Support: USC's College Advising Corps

- 44 USC college advisors currently serve 39 local high schools in 8 partners district
- Local partner districts in Los Angeles County include:
  - ≻ Alhambra USD
  - Compton USD
  - Downey USD
  - ≻ El Monte USD
  - ➤ Long Beach USD
  - ➤ Los Angeles USD
  - ≻ Lynwood USD
- Application process to join that included:
  - ➤ Meeting with Dr. Francois and Dr. Smith
  - ➢ Meeting with PHS Administration
  - ➢ Meeting with PHS Counselors



# Benefits

 Additional college counseling/advising support from highly trained individuals is <u>always</u> welcome

➤ Currently, 2 college/career counselors support this work at PHS (≈ 3,200 students)

- Expands ability to improve college enrollment outcomes for student groups:
  - African Americans
  - Students with Disabilities
  - ➤ Males
- CAC pays 40% of the advisor's salary
  PUSD's share of the cost would be \$36,000 per year
- Establishes our first partnership with a major private Southern California university
- Timeliness of a Partnership with USC

Recent announcement of free tuition for families earning < \$80,000</p>



## Next Steps

- If accepted to participate in the program, an agreement will be brought to the Board for consideration in May
- CAC will work with PUSD to hire a college advisor
- Advisor will be trained by USC over the summer
- Advisor begins working at PHS by the first day of school
