RECEIVED THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION FROM THE VENDOR ABOUT RENEWAL COSTS:

Our standard licensing for the MAP Growth Assessment (which covers Math, Reading and Language Usage, English and Spanish versions included) are 13.50 per student annually. For this fall, NWEA is able to offer a pilot with no licensing costs from 8/11/20 -11/30/20 - savings of \$5.50 per student). If the district determines they would like to continue with our Assessment for the remainder of the academic year 20-21, the cost would be approx. \$8 per student (12/1/20-6/30/21).

Standard pricing for Online MAP Basics is \$1000 (one time fee) that is also waived for this fall pilot.

This covers the On Demand , Online Course modules to support teachers in understanding the MAP Growth Assessment, how to successfully administer the assessment and how to understand and apply the assessment data to improve student achievement and growth, supports differentiated instruction and interventions to close learning gaps .
