BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

To facilitate appropriate educational progress, some students in special education require programs not available in the District. These students are placed in nonpublic schools (NPS) which provide the necessary programs and services. The District contracts on an as-needed basis or annually based on needs identified through the Individual Education Plan (IEP) process. The IEP team recommends an NPS placement when a student with a disability has exhausted all possible interventions and supports available at the school or district. Attached under separate cover is a list of nonpublic schools and treatment centers used by the District.

The NPS Master Contracts for 2020-21 are developed by the Greater Los Angeles Area SELPAs and include terms and conditions for periods of school closures that are in alignment with SB 98 requirements.

The service also provides students feedback on essays written for their classes or for their college and scholarship applications within 24 hours (usually less). The City of Paramount will reimburse the district for a portion of the cost of this service. This resource will be an important tool in mitigating learning loss in our students as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.
