

- Connected with our most vulnerable families through phone calls
- Developed weekly newsletter to share local resources and information with staff, students and families
- Implemented a family support referral focused on basic needs
- Reintroduced Parent Coffee Corner within a virtual platform





Responding to the Pandemic as a Community School

- 12 Family Newsletters were shared with the school community
- 73 referrals were triaged, processed and connected with resources
- 46 donations of food boxes, groceries and/or gift cards were received by identified families
- 34 additional deliveries of donated food boxes/backpacks were made CS staff for our most vulnerable families
- 375 contacts were made with families during the months of April-June
- Established an Advisory Group







