Frequently Asked Questions

Will summer school be in person or online?

Summer school will be offered in-person only.

Who is eligible for Elementary Summer School?

Students entering 1st-5th grade are eligible for Elementary Summer School. Students entering 6th grade are invited to attend the Middle Summer School Program.

What are the program offerings, dates and hours?

Academic Program

- open to all students
- 4 weeks, June 13-July 8

English Learner Boot Camp

- selected English Learner students will be contacted for registration information
- 1 week, July 11-July 14

Classes will be held Monday-Thursday from 8:00- 11:00 a.m. (hours may vary slightly by site)

PLEASE NOTE: Week of July 4 (holiday), classes will be held (Tuesday 7/5- Friday, 7/8)

Where will classes be offered?

- 1) Collins School (for students in the Collins attendance area)
- 2) Hollydale School (for students in the Hollydale, Roosevelt and Wirtz attendance areas)
- 3) Mark Keppel School (for students in the Mark Keppel, Gaines, Jackson, Los Cerritos and Tanner attendance areas)
- 4) Mokler School (for students in the Mokler, Jefferson and Lincoln attendance areas)

Will transportation be offered to students?

Transportation will be available for qualified students.

Is uniform required for Summer School?

Uniform is not required for Summer School.

Will breakfast and lunch be provided?

Breakfast and lunch will be provided at each summer school site.

What offerings are available to Special Education students?

Students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) are encouraged to take advantage of summer school offerings provided to all students. For students who have Extended School Year (ESY) services designated within their IEP, parents will receive a separate registration form from their case carrier for enrollment.

What will summer school curriculum cover?

Literacy that supports the foundational skills necessary for school success. Math, including basic concepts and problem-solving. Science and Visual & Performing Arts (including culminating assemblies).

How will materials be distributed to students?

Students will receive materials on the first day of school. Materials may include books and individually packaged materials (e.g., pencils, crayons, etc.)

Can I ensure my child will be safe during in-person learning?

Yes, guidelines provided by the Center of Disease Control and the Los Angeles Department of Public Health will be followed.
