2022 Middle Summer School Frequently Asked Questions

Will summer school be in person or online?

Summer school will be offered in-person only.

Who is eligible for Middle Summer School?

Students entering 6-8th grade are eligible for the Middle School Summer Programs.

What are the program offerings, dates, hours and what will be covered?

Academic Program

- open to all students
- Students will develop literacy skills applicable to all content areas using AVID strategies, math concepts and problem solving, and will have an enrichment course.
- 4 weeks, June 13-July 8

English Learner Boot Camp

- selected English Learner students will be contacted for registration information
- Program will cover listening, speaking, reading, and writing.
- 1 week, July 11- July 14

8th Grade Math Program

- selected students will be contacted for registration information
- This program is for exiting 7th graders that will be selected for the Accelerated math program during their 8th grade school year
- 5 weeks, June 13-July 14

Classes will be held Monday-Thursday from 9:00 a.m.- 12:00 p.m. (hours may vary slightly by site)
PLEASE NOTE: Week of July 4 (holiday), classes will be held (Tuesday 7/5- Friday, 7/8)

Will summer school be offered at all middle schools?

All middle school sites will offer these programs. Students will attend based on their home school.

Will transportation be offered to students?

Transportation will be available for qualified students.

Is uniform required for Summer School?

Uniform is not required for Summer School.

Will breakfast and lunch be provided?

Breakfast and lunch will be provided at each summer school site.

What offerings are available to Special Education students?

Students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) are encouraged to take advantage of summer school offerings provided to all students. For students who have Extended School Year (ESY) services designated within their IEP, parents will receive a separate registration form from their case carrier for enrollment.

How will these programs support student learning?

Students will learn skills that will support studies for the next school year.

How will materials be distributed to students?

Students will receive materials on the first day of school. Materials may include book(s) and individually packaged materials (e.g., pencils, crayons, etc).

Can I ensure my child will be safe during in-person learning?

Yes, guidelines provided by the Center of Disease Control and the Los Angeles Department of Public Health will be followed.
